HANGING OF THE GREENS






BIBLE 102: UNDERSTANDING THE OLD TESTAMENT

Our basic Bible studies continue in the New Year with a closer look at the Old Testament. Having completed Bible 101, which was an introduction (survey) of the whole Bible, the next offering will focus more in depth on the Old Testament. Using the study book, *The Epic of Eden*, by Sandra Richter, this 12-week class will help participants understand the Old Testament from a Christian perspective.

Bible 102 will begin with an introductory meeting on Tuesday, January 9, 2018 at 7:00. The weekly classes will be held on Tuesday's starting at 7:00 PM in Room 205 and will last for 90 minutes each. The cost for the study is the cost for the study book. If you order (and pay) through the church office by December 12th, the cost will be \$21, including shipping. WHAT IS ADVENT?

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word adventus, meaning "coming," or "visit" and begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year for Christians. Although we are accustomed to celebrating Christmas on a single day, in both Christian tradition and on the Church calendar, the Christmas season lasts sundown on December 24 (Christmas Eve) through Epiphany of the Lord (January 6). This is sometimes popularly referred to as "the twelve days of Christmas." During Advent, we prepare for, and anticipate, the coming of Christ. We remember the longing of Jews for a Messiah and our own longing for, and need of, forgiveness, salvation and a new beginning. Even as we look back and celebrate the birth of Jesus in a humble stable in Bethlehem, we also look forward anticipating the second coming of Christ as the fulfillment of all that was promised by his first coming.

The first faint traces of Advent emerged in popular piety and custom in various places by the early fourth century. In Spain and Gaul (equivalent to the area we now call Western Europe), Christians observed a period of fasting and preparation for baptism. The region had close links with Eastern Christianity's (Syria and other eastern Mediterranean areas) celebration of the feast of Christ's birth on Epiphany (January 6) as a day for baptism.

Advent symbolizes the present situation of the church in these "last days" (<u>Acts 2:17</u>, <u>Hebrews 1:2</u>), as God's people wait for the return of Christ in glory to consummate his eternal kingdom. The church is in a similar situation to Israel at the end of the Old Testament: In exile, waiting and hoping in prayerful expectation for the coming of the Messiah. Israel looked back to God's past gracious actions on their behalf in leading them out of Egypt in the Exodus, and on this basis they called for God once again to act for them. In the same way, the church, during Advent, looks back upon Christ's coming in celebration while at the same time looking forward in eager anticipation to the coming of Christ's kingdom when he returns for his people. In this light, the Advent hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" perfectly represents the church's cry during the Advent season:

> O come, O come, Emmanuel, And ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here Until the Son of God appears. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

While Israel would have sung the song in expectation of Christ's first coming, the church now sings the song in commemoration of that first coming and in expectation of the second coming in the future.

A MESSAGE FROM FRONTIERS

Frontiers is one of the missions group The Fount supports. Below is a message from Bob Peckham, CEO/US Director of Frontiers.
